WHO SHOULD APPLY

Any academic major is welcome, past students have come from:

- Civil Engineering
- Industrial Engineering
- Public Health
- Psychology
- Must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- Must have completed junior year (at least 90 hours) by the end of Spring 2017
- Must be on track to graduate no sooner than December 2017



Example Research Projects:

- Automated Vehicles
- Child Safety Seat Use Patterns
- Bicycle Safety Data Analysis
- Vehicle Crash Testing and Modeling



Benefits of a Research Experience:

- Explore whether graduate school is right for you
- Visit another campus
- Meet students from across the country with similar interests

Undergraduate Research Experience Opportunity

- Join the team of an on-going transportation safety research project at the Texas A&M Transportation Institute – the largest University-based transportation research institute in the country
- Each student will be paired with a research staff or faculty mentor
- Students create an independent research topic that builds on the mentor's project



\$5,450 will be provided to support the student for ten weeks. The program will also provide housing for the duration of the program, as well as a \$900 food allowance. (Note: wages, fellowship, and food allowance are taxable income.)
