


Game Summary - Aggies vs. New Mexico (52-10)

Kyle Field • College Station, TX • September 2, 2023


Game Notes

- Extremely hot weather kept large numbers of fans from coming out early to tailgate pregame traffic congestion hovered around 10 percent until one hour before kickoff where it started to slowly decline.
- Coke Street leading to University Center Garage was the most congested entry point onto campus. All other entries flowed smoothly.
- A transit bus was stationed at Reed Arena to serve as a "cooling station;" over 70 fans tailgating in the E Lot area used the bus.
- There was a DUI crash at Discovery Dr/Stotzer Pkwy during postgame traffic. Transportation Services quickly redirected the Fan Field exit flow to Penberthy and Kimbrough.
- Fans began leaving at the end of the 3rd quarter. Stallings Garage was the first lot to unload at 10:10 pm. Campus traffic was clear by 10:20 pm.


Game Summary - Aggies vs. ULM (47-3)

Game Notes

- There was a one-hour weather delay at the start of the game. Kick-off was moved to 4:00 pm.
- Adjustments on Coke Street to use both lanes improved D Lot loading.
- Deployed the Meridian Barrier Beam Gate on Houston Street for pregame traffic to enhance pedestrian safety in the Aggie Park/Kyle Field area.
- This was the second game with new parking handheld equipment Transportation Services can now accept credit card payments. Weather did not present any issues with the handheld operations.
- Fans began leaving after the Aggie Band won half time, which spread out postgame congestion and lessened the effects in most areas. CSPD officers flowed traffic on FM 2818 in both directions; however, it was still heavily congested.
- Olsen Blvd safety closure opened about 25 minutes after the game ended.


Shuttle Ridership 22,212




Game Summary - Aggies vs. Auburn (27-10)

Game Notes


- Tailgate drop-off on Houston St was very busy pregame. Transportation Services staff did an excellent job getting the area cleared once the road closed.
- SEC Nation broadcast pregame in Aggie Park, so the Corps used the campus march route. Corps leadership was extremely helpful in keeping lanes on Stallings Blvd open for B Lot parkers and buses during the march.
- Most campus lots emptied within one hour after the game ended. West
 Campus Garage cleared one hour and ten minutes postgame the LED arrows in
 the garage helped direct exiting fans to use both down ramps. This was faster
 than other large SEC games.
- The Olsen Blvd pedestrian safety closure was open about 45 minutes postgame, allowing more fans to get to the Wellborn Rd contraflow lanes.
- College Station police officers gave additional green time for exiting vehicles on FM 2818 to help fans leaving west campus lots.











% of Congested Major




Game Summary - Aggies vs. Alabama (20-26)

Kyle Field • College Station, TX • October 7, 2023

Game Notes

- Early arriving crowds congested roadways went up above 5% starting four hours pregame and stay up there until about 30 minutes prior to kick off. Campus traffic was noticeably lighter around 20 minutes prior to kick off.
- Corps route through Aggie Park and around campus along with Galveston units resulted in longer contraflow operations into University Center Garage (D Lot). Corps stepped off 1 hour and 45 minutes pregame to accommodate the longer route.
- Sold out of prepaid parking except in the Polo Road area, which had 1783 cars parked; about 50% more than Auburn 2023.
- Third highest attendance at Kyle Field. Few people left the game early and many tailgated postgame resulting in delayed start of congestion while fans traveled back to their parking spots and then enjoyed the amazing weather.
- West Campus garage, South Side garage and the Discovery contraflow areas were the last to clear postgame campus traffic at about 1 hour and 45 minutes after the game.


Shuttle Ridership 27,126


Game Summary - Aggies vs. S Carolina (30-17)

Game Notes


- Like other 11 am games, pregame traffic congestion picked up around 9:30 am, but was never heavy compared to the 2022 Florida game, which had similar attendance.
- The final Kyle Field Corps march featured the Rally to the Guidons including a record number of former cadets.
- Aggie Park continues to be a very popular tailgate location extending into the future Association Grand Hall site for the second game in a row. The early game time meant tailgate drop-offs on Throckmorton continued into peak fan arrival times.
- New elevated wayfinding signs on the West Campus Garage side of the passageway helped guide fans back to parking in the garage and other west campus lots.
- Postgame, fans leaving campus used George Bush Dr, Texas Ave and FM 2818 more heavily compared to Wellborn Rd. Northbound 2818 was also backed up postgame between Bush and Wellborn, which could be attributed to community traffic trying to get around town.


Game Summary - Aggies vs. Mississippi St (51-10)

Game Notes


- The game featured numerous military appreciation events including a Corps of Cadets march through academic plaza and onto Simpson Drill Field for review.
- Transportation Services managed the switch into and out of contraflow for University Center Garage smoothly. Contraflow was utilized during team arrivals and for staging of Parsons Mounted Calvary on Coke Street prior to march in.
- Fans began arriving at parking lots around 9:30 am and steadily increased until 5:00 pm. Campus streets and parking lot entries were quiet at 6:20 pm. Congestion stayed in the range of five to 10 percent of city streets for the four hours leading up until game time.
- Polo Road area continues to gain popularity 2nd game this season with over 1,700 cars parked. The Bonfire shuttle route had season high ridership 2,100 riders.
- A 38-point lead at the end of the 3rd quarter contributed to fans leaving early. Additionally, there was a better balance of cars on Wellborn Road and FM 2818. Together, the result was lower peak congestion levels and overall congestion on the street network postgame.


Shuttle Ridership 27,955




Game Summary - Aggies vs. ACU (38-10)

Game Notes


- Senior Day, Bonfire Memorial remembrance, Corps of Cadets tribute, and halftime honoring Jackie Sherrill and the 12th man special teams all helped provide a fun game experience for fans despite a late season non-conference game.
- Like many early games, fans did not start arriving until after 9:30 AM and traffic congestion in town was minimal leading up to kick-off, peaking at eight percent of streets. Backups were seen on SH 6 northbound south of town from fans going to the game from the Houston area. Similar congestion was observed going southbound after the game.
- A train came through right before the end of the game, but did not affect postgame traffic as most fans stayed to the end after being treated to several Aggie traditions throughout the game including an all walk on special teams in the fourth quarter.
- Parking areas near Kyle Field were clear of postgame traffic around 45 minutes after the final play, but road closures near the Bell Tower stayed in place to assist with shuttles that run until one hour post game.


Shuttle Ridership 25,255






